

# MUR service - list of medicines

October 2011

From 1 October 2011 three national target groups were introduced for the MUR service:

1. patients recently discharged from hospital who had changes made to their medicines while they were in hospital;
2. patients with respiratory disease; and
3. patients taking high risk medicines.

The medicines selected for inclusion in the latter two target groups are those that are listed in the sub-sections, detailed below, of the current edition of the British National Formulary ([www.bnf.org](http://www.bnf.org)).
